

Understanding what a positive COVID-19 test result means

The COVID-19 test detects if the virus is in your nose or mouth.

It is important that you understand what it means if your COVID-19 test is positive.

By law, you must self-isolate for at least 10 days after the test, even if you do not have any symptoms.

If you get any symptoms, you must stay in self-isolation for 10 days after your symptoms appear.

Anyone who has been in close contact with you must also, by law, selfisolate for at least 14 days and watch for symptoms.

Very rarely, the COVID-19 test is falsely positive. This means you do not have the virus and you cannot pass it to anyone. There is no way to tell if a false positive result is wrong.
